Successful candidates are expected to be internationally renowned in synthetic inorganic chemistry with reference to the life sciences complementing and strengthening the areas represented by the existing research groups in the department of chemistry.

He/she is expected to actively participate in the acquisition of third party research funding. Teaching is an integral part of the professorial position and teaching in German and English language in all stages of the study courses is required.
